Pre-selection process (mandatory if you are a non-EU citizen)

Only if you are a non-EU citizen and reside abroad you must have registered for the pre-selection process by submitting your application via the **QS MoveIn** platform by the deadlines indicated at the following link:
<https://www.uniroma1.it/en/node/256794>. If you are successful in the pre-selection process, accept the course offer on the platform and download the pre-acceptance letter. A fee of **30,00 euros** is payable, which is separate from the subsequent € 10,00 contribution ([point 6](#)). The deadline for non-EU citizens residing abroad who require a student visa is 15 May 2026.

Apply for a visa (non-EU citizenship)

If you are a non-EU citizen and reside abroad, please visit the [University](#) platform to apply for a student visa; complete and submit your application by 30 June 2026.

Pay the enrolment fees

Pay the course enrolment fees by the specified deadlines.
Please note! If you are resident for tax purposes in Italy and wish to pay a reduced fee, you must calculate your [Isee 2026](#) in good time to qualify for university study grants. You can contact a tax assistance centre (CAF) or visit the [Inps website](#).
If you are resident for tax purposes abroad, you will pay a fixed amount ([point 7](#)).

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1. Admission to the programme

To gain admission to the three-year degree programme taught in English in **Sustainable Building Engineering**, you must:

- take the CEnT-S (including the @CASA option) or the SAT ([point 4](#));
- register for the pre-selection process (mandatory only if you are a non-EU citizen and reside abroad)
- apply for a student visa if you are a non-EU citizen and reside abroad;
- pay the € 10,00 fee ([point 6](#));
- pay the enrolment fees ([point 7](#)).

Please note

You must use the **same email address** for all platforms involved in the procedure:

- CISIA or College Board, for taking the entrance test
- Move-IN, for pre-selection;
- Infostud, for payments of fees due to the University.

Please check that the email address provided is correct and check your inbox regularly.

2. Requirements and conditions

2.1 - For Italian citizens, citizens of other EU countries, and citizens of non-EU countries with a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU citizens treated as equivalent)

If you are a citizen of:

- Italy;
- an EU country other than Italy;
- a non-EU country and hold a valid residence permit in Italy (Article 26 of Law No. 189/2002), you must meet the following requirements:

- upper secondary school diploma** obtained or to be obtained in 2026.
If you hold a qualification obtained within a foreign secondary education system, you must carefully read the list of required documents on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#) (for foreign qualifications, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#));
- adequate knowledge of the English language at least equivalent to level B2** according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). See [Annex 5](#) to check whether you meet the requirements.
- CEnT-S (including the @CASA mode)** - taken from November 2025 onwards and by the deadline set for the selection process;
or
SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) General Test, organised by the College Board, which can be taken at any SAT Centre worldwide, from 1 January 2023 and by the deadlines set for the selection process.

2.2 - For non-EU citizens applying for a student visa

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country (or if you are a Chinese citizen and you have submitted a pre-enrollment application in the “Marco Polo” programme at Sapienza for the 2025–2026 academic year), reside abroad and need to apply for an entry student visa, you must meet the following requirements:

- a secondary school leaving certificate** obtained or to be obtained in 2026.
- If you hold a qualification obtained within a foreign secondary education system, you must carefully read the list of documents required for enrolment as indicated on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#) (for foreign qualifications, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#));

- c. adequate knowledge of English equivalent to at least level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). See [Annex 5](#) to check whether you meet the requirements.
- d. **CEnT-S (including the @CASA mode)** - taken from November 2025 onwards and by the deadline set for the selection process;
or
SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) General Test, organised by the College Board, which can be taken at any SAT Centre worldwide, from 1 January 2023 and by the deadlines set for the selection process.

- e. **Letter of pre-acceptance** to the degree programme in Sustainable Building Engineering – downloaded in .pdf format following a successful outcome of the pre-selection process carried out via the link <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/node/256794> and confirmation of the invitation contained therein. Prior acceptance by the University does not confer any right to obtain a visa;
- f. **online pre-enrolment application, to obtain a student visa** “University enrolment” for the 2026-2027 academic year, on the University website (<https://www.universitaly.it/>) which must be completed and submitted by 30 June 2026. Pre-enrolment on the University website is mandatory to obtain an entry visa for study purposes.
Please note: pre-enrolment alone does not guarantee admission to degree programmes. To enrol, you must complete the procedures set out in this call for applications.

2.3 - For students with a certified disability/invalidity

You are not required to take the CEnT-S (including the @CASA version) or the SAT if you have a recognised disability under Article 3, paragraph 1 or 3 of Law No. 104 of 5 February 1992, or a disability certificate. Any further required courses (OFA) will be assessed and assigned by the Faculty in the manner deemed most appropriate. 2.4 - For students diagnosed with Specific Learning Disorders (SLDs)

If you have been diagnosed with specific learning disorders you may request specific aids to take the CEnT-S (including the @CASA mode) or the SAT using the procedures set out in [Annex 3](#). For further information, please visit the University website [Go to page](#).

3. Calendar and deadlines

Pease note

If you take the test by the deadline but do not pay the € 10,00 fee by the same deadline, you will not be able to enrol.

If you pay the € 10,00 fee by the deadline but do not take the CEnT-S (including the @CASA version) or the SAT by the same deadline, you will not be able to enrol.

4. Enrolment in CEnT-S or SAT

To register for the CEnT-S (including the @CASA option), please visit the website <https://www.cisiaonline.it/en>, where you will also find details of how to register and the test schedule. Please also read [Annex 1](#) carefully. Registration closes at 2.00 pm, approximately one week before the scheduled test date. (for further details, see the page [CISIA Test Calendars](#)).

To register for the SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) General Test and submit your test results, follow the instructions in Annex 1 ([point A1.2](#)).

5. Registration on Infostud

To register with Infostud, you will need to enter your details in the form available on the Sapienza website at the following link <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students>. If you are an Italian citizen, you will need your SPID or CIE credentials.

Please note

If you are already registered with Infostud, you must verify/enter your email address on the IDM dashboard by logging in with your SPID/CIE credentials or your student ID number and password <https://idm.uniroma1.it/>

The tax code entered on the Cisia website when registering for the TOLC-I (including the TOLC@CASA mode) must match the one entered on Infostud; otherwise, it will be impossible to retrieve the score obtained in the test.

The email address entered on Infostud at the time of registration must be correct and valid, and you must check it regularly throughout the procedure as it will be used for any communications from the University.

6. Payment of the € 10,00 fee

To pay the € 10,00 fee:

- log in to Infostud using your credentials <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students>;
- click on "Degree programmes";
- go to "Degree programme access"
- enter the code **33482**
- click on 'Continue' and then 'Next';
- click on 'Direct payment (PagoPA)'. You can only pay online, by credit card.

The € 10,00 fee will not be refunded under any circumstances.

7. Enrolment

Final enrolment on the degree programme is achieved by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees for the 2026-2027 academic year, to which the € 16,00 stamp duty and the regional tax must be added. The payment instructions can be found at the following link <https://www.uniroma1.it/it/node/24689>.

The code to enter is **33482**.

During the procedure, you may specify any conditions for exemption from enrolment fees and the regional tax. The € 16,00 stamp duty is payable in all cases.

It is extremely important at this stage to have obtained your 2026 ISEE calculation for university study entitlement in order to benefit from the exemptions and concessions provided for on the basis of this indicator (see [Annex 4](#)).

7.1 - Enrolment deadline

If you have taken the CEnT-S (including via @CASA) and hold an Italian or foreign qualification, to enrol you must pay the first instalment of university enrolment fees **from 1 September 2026** and by **Thursday 5 November 2026**.

If you have taken the SAT and hold an Italian or foreign qualification, to enrol you must:

- log in to Infostud using your credentials;
- click on Profile > ISEE > Obtain ISEE (only if you are resident for tax purposes in Italy);
- enter any conditions for exemption from tuition fees and the regional tax
- send the **SAT Score Report** to the Administrative Office at the email address segrstudenti.ingegneria@uniroma1.it **by 29 October 2026**, requesting that a payment slip for the tuition fees be generated;
- pay the first instalment of the university enrolment fees **from 1 September 2026 and by Thursday 5 November 2026 using the following procedure:**
- log in to Infostud using your credentials;
- click on Payment Slips and then on Generated Payment Slips;
- pay the amount online via PagoPA (direct payment).

If you wish, you can **attend lectures** even before paying the enrolment fee.

7.2 - For students with a qualification from a foreign secondary education system

If you hold a qualification obtained within a foreign secondary education system, to enrol you must follow the instructions on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#) (for foreign qualifications, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#)).

7.3 - For students transferring from another Sapienza degree programme

If you are currently enrolled on another Sapienza degree programme and wish to request recognition of the exams taken on your previous programme, you must submit a transfer application using the form "Transfer between programmes with recognition of exams", available on the university website in the 'Attachments' section of the following page <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/student-forms>.

The transfer application must be sent by email no later than the deadlines for payment of course enrolment fees indicated in [point 7.1](#) including both the Student Affairs Office of your current course and the Student Affairs Office of the course you wish to enrol in among the recipients (see [point 10](#)).

Please note: once you have submitted your transfer application, you will not be able to take exams for your original course.

7.4 - For students transferring from another Italian university

If you are currently enrolled on a degree programme at another Italian university and wish to apply for recognition of the exams you have taken on your previous programme, you must pay the enrolment fee for your chosen new degree programme by the deadlines specified in [point 7.1](#). You must then submit your transfer application within ten days of paying the fees.

Please note: once you have paid the transfer fee, you will no longer be able to take exams for your original degree programme.

7.5 - For students with an Italian university qualification

If you already hold a degree from an Italian university and wish to apply for the recognition of university credits acquired during your previous degree programme, **within 15 calendar days of paying the first instalment of the course enrolment fees**, you must submit your application by following the instructions on the Sapienza website. [Go to page](#)

If you obtained your degree from a university other than Sapienza, you must also attach a self-certification of your qualification, including details of the exams, corresponding marks, Scientific Disciplinary Sectors (SSD) and credits.

The application will be assessed by the relevant faculty bodies.

7.6 - For students who have obtained a qualification from a foreign university system

If you hold a degree obtained in a foreign university system and wish to apply for the recognition of university exams taken abroad, you must follow the instructions on the Sapienza website on the dedicated page [Go to page](#) Please also read the information in Annex 2, [point A2.6](#).

8. Withdrawal from enrolment

If, after paying your fees, you wish to withdraw from the course, you must follow this procedure:

- activate your institutional email address using the instructions provided on the University website at <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/email-google-apps>;
- log in to the ticket platform <https://tts.uniroma1.it/otrs/customer.pl> select the academic office responsible for your degree programme;
- select the 'Withdrawal from studies' service, complete the relevant form and attach the receipt for payment of the stamp duty.

Withdrawal from enrolment for non-EU citizens who hold a residence permit for study purposes

If you are a non-EU citizen, hold a residence permit for study purposes and withdraw from enrolment at Sapienza or another university, **you will no longer meet the requirements for residence in Italy, resulting in the revocation of your residence permit.**

In this case, you will need to return to your country of origin and complete the pre-selection procedure on the QS MoveIn platform again by 15 May 2026 (<https://www.uniroma1.it/en/node/256794>) and the pre-enrolment procedure via the University online platform (<https://www.universitaly.it/>) no later than 30 June 2026.

9. Further Required Courses (OFA)

Further Required Courses (OFA) in **Mathematics** are assigned to those who achieve a score lower than:

- **18** in the **normalised score obtained in the CEnT-S** (including the TOLC@CASA mode);
- **800/1600** in the SAT.

The OFAs are considered fulfilled:

- by passing the resit (OFA test) – the dates and procedures for the tests will be published on the university course catalogue page, in the 'Attendance' section, and on the Faculty's webpage <https://ici.web.uniroma1.it/en> or
- upon passing the **Analysis I e II** exam.

The Faculty of Civil and Industrial Engineering organises mathematics support courses in English, taught by tutors, aimed both at catching up on OFA requirements and at enabling students to attend first-year courses.

Information on how to enrol in remedial courses, how to take the OFA exam, and all other news regarding the OFA will be published in the 'Attendance' section of the degree programme page in the degree programme catalogue <https://corsidilaurea.uniroma1.it/en>.

Please note

The OFA must be passed within the first year of the programme. If you do not pass the OFA, you will have to repeat the first year and will not be able to take exams for years beyond the first, starting from the 2027–2028 academic year.

Annex 1 - CEnT-S and SAT Tests

A1.1 - CEnT-S (CISIA English Test – Sciences)

You can take the CEnT – S if you are enrolled in the fourth or fifth year of upper secondary school or if you have already obtained a school leaving certificate.

CEnT-S tests are administered via a computerised platform in two ways: in specially equipped university examination rooms (CEnT@UNI; in this case, you must present proof of payment and enrolment upon entering the room) or remotely, in virtual examination rooms supervised by invigilators appointed by the universities organising the test (CEnT@CASA).

The CEnT-S test dates are spread across **4 main periods**:

FIRST MAIN PERIOD (November 2025 to January 2026)

SECOND MAIN PERIOD (February to March 2026)

THIRD MAJOR PERIOD (April to June 2026)

FOURTH MAJOR PERIOD (September to October 2026)

You may take a CEnT test only once per macro-period for each type of CEnT, regardless of where you book the test or how it is administered.

A1.1.2 - CEnT-S structure

The CEnT-S structure – comprising the sections of the test, the number of questions per section, the time allowed for each section, and the syllabus – is always up to date and available on the CISIA portal.

The questions are multiple-choice, offering 5 possible options, only one of which is correct.

The test is in English and is designed for courses taught in this language.

The CEnT-S structure for the 2025–2026 academic year comprises **5 sections, totalling 55 questions**:

- Mathematics: 15 questions (30 minutes)
- Reasoning on texts and data: 15 questions (30 minutes)
- Biology: 10 questions (20 minutes)
- Chemistry: 10 questions (20 minutes)
- Physics: 5 questions (10 minutes)

To apply for the degree programme in this call for application, you will be required to complete all the sections of the CEnT-S.

A1.1.3 - Assessment and results

Upon completion of the test, you will immediately be able to view a summary of your performance in terms of the number of correct, incorrect and unanswered answers.

To ensure the fairness and comparability of results obtained across different test dates, CISIA applies a **standardisation** process to the scores. Upon completion of the standardisation process, CISIA provides participants and test centres with the standardised score, which may be officially used at all participating centres.

A1.2 - SAT General test

The SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) General Test (hereinafter, SAT) is a test used in the admissions processes of colleges and universities worldwide. Administered in English, the SAT comprises a **Reading Test**, a **Writing and Language Test**, and a **Math Test**. It is administered by the **College Board**: further information, such as the test schedule, fees, test centres and deadlines, is available on the College Board website: <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/>. The breakdown of the number of questions and the time allowed for each section is shown in the table below.

Test	Number of questions/tasks	Time allowed
------	---------------------------	--------------

Reading	52	65 minutes
Writing and language	44	35 minutes
Math test – no calculator	20	25 minutes
Math test – calculator	38	55 minutes
Total	154	180 minutes (3 hours)

After taking the test, you will receive a score (SAT Total Score) that summarises your results across the test sections. The score is reported on a scale of 400 to 1600 and combines the **Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score** and the **Math score** (each on a scale of 200–800). The score report provides further information based on additional sub-scores.

This score is required for the admissions process and determines whether you will be granted Ofa status, as outlined in [point 9](#).

If you take the SAT multiple times from 1 January 2023 onwards, the highest score obtained from those you have asked the College Board to send to Sapienza by 29 October 2026 will be considered.

You must send your SAT scores to Sapienza via the College Board, specifying the following Higher Education Institution Code:

Annex 2 - Citizenship in EU countries and in non-EU countries with a residence permit in Italy (non-EU citizens treated as equivalent)

A2.1 - Citizenship in EU countries and in non-EU countries with a residence permit in Italy (non-EU citizens treated as equivalent)

The following persons are eligible under the general procedures of the call for applications:

- Citizens of a European Union Member State or of one of the following countries: Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland, the Republic of San Marino, the Vatican City State;
Citizens with dual nationality, one of which is that of a European Union Member State;
- hold the citizenship of a non-EU country but also hold one of the following residence permits issued by the Italian Government:
 - o EU long-term resident's permit;
 - o Residence permit for employment or self-employment;
 - o Residence permit for family reasons;
 - o Residence permit for political asylum, subsidiary protection or special reasons;
 - o Residence permit for religious reasons;
 - o Residence card under Article 50 TEU – Article 18.4 of the EU-UK
- are citizens of a non-EU country but have been lawfully resident in Italy for at least one year and hold an upper secondary school qualification obtained in Italy that grants access to their chosen degree programme, or hold a degree or an accredited Foundation Year certificate obtained at an Italian university and duly recognised by the MUR, in the 2025/2026 academic year;
- are citizens of a non-EU country and are duly enrolled on a degree programme at an Italian university, hold a valid residence permit for study purposes and intend to apply for a transfer or change of programme for years following that of their initial enrolment;
- are citizens of a non-EU country and are (themselves, or a parent or spouse) members of staff serving in foreign diplomatic missions and international organisations based in Italy, accredited to the Italian State or the Holy See. Their residence permit for diplomatic purposes must be submitted.

If you hold a residence permit for study purposes in Italy issued for

- attending an Italian language course
- undertaking an exchange or mobility programme
- attending a 'single course'

please follow the instructions set out in [point A2.3](#)

A2.2 - Dual citizenship

If you hold dual citizenship, one of which is Italian or that of another EU country, Italian citizenship or that of the other EU country takes precedence (Law No. 218 of 31 May 1995, Article 19, paragraph 2) and therefore, to enrol on the degree programme specified in this call for applications, you must follow the instructions set out for those who hold citizenship of an EU country and a non-EU country and are holders of a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU citizens treated as equivalent).

A2.3 - Citizenship of non-EU countries, residence abroad and application for a student visa

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country, reside in a country other than Italy and do not meet the requirements set out in point A2.1, in order to enrol on the course specified in this call for applications, you must apply for an entry visa for study purposes as set out in [point 2.2](#).

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country and hold a residence permit for study purposes in Italy, issued to enable you to undertake an Italian language course or to take part in an exchange or mobility programme, in order to enrol on the degree programme covered by this call for applications, you must return to your country of origin and submit an application for an entry visa for study purposes as set out in [point 2.2](#).

A residence permit for study issued for a 'single course' will be considered valid for university enrolment as an EU equivalent only if all three of the following requirements are met in the 2025/2026 academic year:

- You entered the country on a student visa issued specifically for individual courses

- You have regularly attended the individual course and passed the relevant assessment
- The individual course you attended is relevant to the degree programme you have chosen for your future academic career

If even one of the listed requirements does not apply, in order to enrol on the degree programme covered by this call for applications, you must return to your country of origin and submit an application for an entry visa for study purposes as indicated in [point 2.2](#).

A2.4 - “Marco Polo” Programme

If you are a Chinese citizen, are participating in the ‘Marco Polo’ project for Sapienza and have submitted your pre-enrolment application to the Italian diplomatic and consular missions in China for the 2025/2026 academic year, you may take part in the selection process for places reserved for the ‘**Marco Polo**’ project.

A2.5 - Enrolment for holders of a foreign qualification

If you hold a qualification obtained within a foreign secondary education system, in order to enrol by the deadlines set out in [point 7.1](#) you must:

Send the resulting file to the Hello-International Students’ Office at the email address studentistranieri@uniroma1.it ensuring that the subject line of the email includes the following text: “Ready for enrolment + course code and course title + student registration number + student’s surname and first name”.

A2.6 - Course shortening for holders of foreign university qualifications

Students holding a degree from a foreign higher education system who wish to apply for the recognition of university examinations taken abroad must submit a request to the International Students’ Office, accompanied by a €16.00 revenue stamp, within 30 days of the enrolment date, following the procedure below:

- complete enrolment and pay the enrolment fees in accordance with the procedures set out in [point 7](#)
- activate their institutional email address following the instructions on the university website at the following page <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/email-google-apps>;
- submit a ticket to the International Students’ Office <https://tts.uniroma1.it/otrs/customer.pl> completing the application form and attaching the documents listed on the Sapienza website, on the dedicated page. [Go to page \(14. Course shortening\)](#)

Following the administrative checks, the “Hello – International Students’ Office” reserves the right to request further documentation if it deems it necessary, and to reject the application for recognition if the necessary requirements are not met.

Once the necessary checks on the foreign qualifications submitted have been completed, the application will be sent by the Hello - International Students' Office to the relevant student office for the administrative process.

The application will be assessed by the relevant faculty bodies.

Annex 3 - Services for SLDs – Specific Learning Disorders

A3.1 - Request for SLD aids for CEnT-S

If you have been diagnosed with a specific learning disorder (SLD), as defined by Law No. 170/2010 and Ministerial Decree No. 5669/2011, and require specific aids for taking the CEnT-S exam due to the nature of your SLD, **you must declare your condition** when registering on the CISIA portal.

In this case, you are entitled to:

- 30% extra time on top of the time allocated for the test;
- the use of a basic non-scientific calculator, subject to the certification provided.

If you indicate Sapienza as the venue where you intend to take the test, you must upload the necessary certificates and documentation to prove your SLD status via a dedicated document upload form provided by CISIA, which will forward the documentation to Sapienza.

Requests must be received no later than the CEnT-S registration deadline and must be accompanied by appropriate SLD certification issued by National Health Service (NHS) facilities or by specialists and facilities accredited by the NHS. You can check the allocation of support measures within the test delivery platform.

If the attached documents do not specify the accreditation of the facilities **or specialists** who issued the certification, you must add a note confirming this accreditation.

The DSA certification must be detailed and clear, including reference to the nosographic codes and an explicit description of the DSA (relating to reading and/or writing and/or arithmetic).

The diagnosis must have been issued no more than three years ago if it relates to minors.

A3.2 - Request for SLD ids for the SAT

If you have a diagnosis of a learning disability, you are entitled to specific aids and accommodations during the SAT. Some of the aids available include: extended time, extra and extended breaks, and reading and visual aids. These aids must be approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (<https://accommodations.collegeboard.org/>).

Approval can take several weeks, so you must submit your request well in advance.

SLD certification for students residing abroad

A3.3 - SLD certification for students residing abroad

If you reside in a foreign country and have a diagnosis of a specific learning disability (SLD), in order to benefit from accommodations during the test, you must submit a legalised certificate—where required by applicable international regulations—attesting to your SLD status, issued in your country of residence, accompanied by a translation that is either sworn by an official translator or certified as a true copy of the original text by Italian diplomatic missions, in Italian or English.

Annex 4 - Isee for the right to university education

The ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) for the right to university education is required to obtain a reduction in tuition fees (the lower the ISEE value, the lower the amount to be paid).

The ISEE calculation for university education support must be requested from the Tax Assistance Centres (CAF) after 15 January 2026 and at least 30 days before the relevant deadlines ([point 7.1](#))

For those who have a PIN code or SPID digital identity (a unique code for accessing all digital and online services of the Public Administration), it is also possible to request the 2026 ISEE calculation directly online by submitting the DSU (Single Substitute Declaration) on the INPS website (<https://www.inps.it/it/en.html>).

For non-Italian citizens and/or those declaring income earned abroad who are therefore unable to provide an ISEE certificate, a fixed-rate enrolment fee applies, depending on the country of origin.

Annex 5 - English language proficiency requirements

To be admitted to the degree programme, you must have a command of English equivalent to at least level B2 according to the [Common European Framework of Reference for Languages \(CEFR\)](#). To prove your English language proficiency, you must meet at least one of the following requirements:

- a) Hold **one of the following certificates** attesting to English language proficiency at level B2:
 - IELTS with a minimum score of 5.5
 - TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 80
 - Cambridge English B2 (First or higher)
 - Trinity College London Integrated Skills in English - ISE (Level II or higher)

- b) Meet one of the following criteria:
 - Be a native English speaker
 - Hold a diploma or degree in English awarded by an accredited institution in the EU/EEA/Schengen area, or in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom or the United States;
 - Hold an **International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma** or a **General Certificate of Education (GCE)** or an equivalent diploma/certificate.
 - Hold a diploma or degree awarded by an accredited institution where English is the primary language of instruction.
