DECLARATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH SAPIENZA FUNDAMENTAL VALUES AND PRINCIPLES OF OPEN SCIENCE, ETHICS, SECURITY

I, the undersigned, _____ affiliated to the following institution: _____, hereby declare, under my sole responsibility, that I fully complies with the principles and requirements to the present call for Visiting Professor applications. In particular, I declare adherence to the following principles:

1. Respect for Fundamental Values

The participant is committed to upholding and promoting the fundamental values of the European Union, Italian Constitution and Sapienza Statute and Ethical Code; in particular, activities carried out under the **Visiting Professor Call** shall comply with:

- respect of basic EU values such as respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law and human rights, including the rights of minorities;
- ethical principles and relevant national, Union and international law, including the European Charter of Researchers and the Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers, Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union and the European Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms;
- the values of the Constitution of the Italian Republic, especially regarding the development of culture and scientific and technical research (Article 9), the freedom of teaching and research (Article 33), the right of capable and deserving individuals to achieve the highest levels of education (Article 34);
- the values upheld by Sapienza University, as established in its Statute and Code of Ethics.

2. Open Science



Sapienza promotes open science as a collaborative and transparent approach to scientific research and dissemination. Specifically, the participant commits to:

- ensuring open access to scientific publications and research data resulting from joint projects, in line with the principle “as open as possible, as closed as necessary¹”
- responsible data management aligned with the FAIR principles (Findability, Accessibility, Interoperability, and Reusability).

2. Ethics and Research Integrity

The participant commits to the highest ethical standards, in full compliance with relevant European Union law, national and international legislation, the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights, and the European Convention on Human Rights. Specifically, the participant undertakes to:

- respect fundamental rights including human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law, and human rights, with particular attention to the rights of minorities and vulnerable groups;
- apply the European Code of Conduct for Research Integrity (ALLEA), ensuring transparency, objectivity, accountability, and responsible authorship;
- ensure that no activity prohibited in any EU Member State is conducted within or outside the EU;
- obtain all necessary approvals and documents from national or local ethics committees, data protection authorities, or other relevant bodies prior to the start of any research activity;
- perform activities in compliance with the European Chart of Researchers and the Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers.

The participant also acknowledges that the development of activities may require support from the Ethics Committee for Transdisciplinary Research, in accordance with the Sapienza Regulations of the Ethics Committee for Transdisciplinary Research as well as the Sapienza Guidelines for Dual Use Research.

4. Security and Confidentiality
