Fellowships for the International Mobility of PhD Candidates MIUR Sostegno Giovani Fund (DM MIUR 976/2014)

Sapienza fosters PhD international mobility through a dedicated fellowship program addressed to PhD candidates enrolled in the 2nd and 3rd year.

**Last call: published on 13 June 2018
(deadline 14 September 2018)**

The fellowship provides financial support for joint research activities involving min. 2 PhD candidates (max. 5) carried out in academic or non-academic institutions abroad.



- **Duration:** minimum 3 months to a maximum of 6 months on a continuous basis!
- **When:** starting from the second year of doctoral school. The mobility periods has to take place and be concluded within the 3 years of enrollment to the doctoral school and, in any case, by the date of dissertation.
- **Financing:** €1.000,00/month for PhD fellowship holders (compatible with the integration for abroad mobility) - €1.500,00/month for candidates without fellowship.



ERASMUS +: WHAT TO DO

Study

from 3 to 12 months in a European or non European university

With the possibility to:

- Attend classes and take exams or write the final dissertation;
- Get the full recognition of the study project in the student's career at home university;
- Do the mobility again;
- Average grant about 500,00 euro/month;
- Calls published simultaneously in all faculties with specific criteria: normally at the end of January/February every year.

ERASMUS +: WHAT TO DO

Traineeship *Unipharma-Graduates Consortia*

- ❑ Internship in public and private research centres (chemical, pharmaceutical and biotechnological) and European organizations: from 2 to 12 months;
- ❑ Mobility for PhD students in the field of Biology, Biotech, Pharmacy and Chemistry.
- ❑ Average grant about 375,00 euro/month;
- ❑ PhD Students from disadvantaged backgrounds may be allocated an additional grant, based on ISEE, financed by EU and MIUR funding;
- ❑ **Last call: published on 30 October 2018
(deadline on 29 November 2018)**

Mobility periods in NON EU countries

1. Bilateral Agreements for student mobility

Aim of mobility: research

- Funding granted by Ministry of Education and Research (Fondo Giovani) + by Sapienza (own budget)
- Funding available only for PhD candidates who are NOT scholarship holders (dottorandi senza borsa)
- Calls launched by the single faculties all year long (keep always an eye on the website page: <https://www.uniroma1.it/it/node/24778>)
- Scholarship amount: € 2.100,00 for a minimum stay of 3 months at the host university (shorter periods of stay are not allowed) till max 1 year

Mobility periods in NON EU countries

2. ERASMUS+ International Credit Mobility

Aim of mobility: research

- Funding granted by National Agency Erasmus+ (origin of the funding: European Commission)
- Funding available for all PhD candidates (with or without the PhD fellowship)
- Calls launched twice a year by the International Office – next call will presumably open in late January 2019
- Scholarship amount: € 650,00 per month for a minimum stay of 3 months at the host university (shorter periods of stay are not allowed)
- Travel ticket reimbursement according to the travel distances
