1. Access to the programme

To access the three-year degree programmes in English listed in this call for applications, you must:

- take the **ENGLISH TEST HUMANITIES@HOME (ENGLISH TEST HUM@HOME)** ([point 4](#));
- register for the pre-selection process (only if you are a non-EU citizen and reside abroad)
- apply for an entry visa for study purposes (only if you are a citizen of a non-EU country and reside abroad);
- pay the € 45,00 fee to take the test ([point 6](#));
- pay the programme enrolment fees ([point 7](#)).

Please note

You must use the **same email address** for all platforms involved in the procedure:

- Move-IN, for pre-selection;
- Infostud, for payments of fees due to the University.

Please check that the email address you have provided is correct and check your inbox regularly.

2. Requirements and conditions

2.1 - For those with Italian citizenship, EU citizenship or non-EU citizenship with a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU equivalent)

- If you are a citizen of:
 - Italy;
 - an EU country other than Italy;
 - a non-EU country and have a valid residence permit in Italy (Art. 26 of Law No. 189/2002), you must meet the following requirements:

a. Secondary school diploma obtained or to be obtained in 2026.

If you have a qualification obtained in a foreign secondary education system, you must carefully read the list of required documents on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#) (for foreign qualifications, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#));

b. certification attesting to knowledge of the English language at least at level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). See [Annex 4](#) to find out if you meet the language proficiency requirements;

c. ENGLISH TEST HUMANITIES (in TEST@HOME mode) - CISIA - taken on one of the dates specified in this call for applications.

Further information on the test is available in [Annex 1](#).

2.2 - For citizens of a non-EU country who require a visa for study purposes

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country (or are a Chinese national and are participating in the “Marco Polo” project for Sapienza in the academic year 2025-2026), reside abroad and need to apply for a study visa upon entry, you must meet the following requirements:

a. secondary school diploma obtained or to be obtained in 2026.

If you have a qualification obtained in a foreign secondary education system, you must carefully read the list of documents required for enrolment on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#) (for foreign qualifications, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#));

b. certification attesting to knowledge of the English language at least at level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). See [Annex 4](#) to understand if you meet the language proficiency requirements;

c. ENGLISH TEST HUMANITIES (in TEST@HOME mode) - CISIA - taken on the dates specified in this call for applications. Further information on the test is available in [Annex 1](#).

d. **Letter of pre-acceptance** to the degree programme in **Global Humanities** or the degree programme in **Classics Classical Civilisations and Literatures**, downloaded in .pdf format following successful completion of the pre-selection process carried out by <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions> and confirmation of the invitation contained therein.

Prior acceptance by the University does not confer any right to obtain a visa;

e. **online pre-enrolment application, to obtain an entry visa for study purposes** 'University enrolment' for the academic year 2026-2027, on the University website (<https://www.universitaly.it/>), which must be completed and submitted by 30 June 2026. Pre-enrolment on the University website is mandatory in order to obtain an entry visa for study purposes.

Please note: pre-enrolment alone does not guarantee admission to degree programmes. In order to enrol, you must complete the procedures set out in this call for applications.

2.3 – For those who already have a degree

If you already have a degree, you do not need to take the ENGLISH TEST HUM.

Any additional educational requirements (OFA) will be verified and assigned by the Faculty in the manner deemed most appropriate.

To request a possible shortening of the degree programme, please also read [point 7.5](#).

To enrol in the degree programme, follow this procedure:

- register with Infostud as indicated in [point 5](#);
- log in to Infostud with your credentials and go to Profile;
- go to Isee>acquire Isee;
- still in the Profile function, declare any conditions for exemptions or concessions;
- send an email to the administrative office ([point 10](#)) asking them to generate the enrolment form, stating the reason for exemption from the test (degree already obtained) and the programme code
33537 for Global Humanities
33528 for Classics
- once the secretariat has generated the payment slip, log back into Infostud and go to Generated payment slips;
- Pay the form by 5 November 2026 using PagoPA direct payment (you can only pay online, by credit card).

At this stage, it is extremely important to have obtained the **2026 ISEE calculation for the right to university education** in order to take advantage of the exemptions and concessions provided for on the basis of this indicator ([Annex 5](#)).

Any additional educational requirements (OFA) will be verified and assigned by the Faculty in the manner deemed most appropriate.

To register for the HUM@HOME ENGLISH TEST, you must pay a fee of € 45,00 ([point 6](#)).

5. Registration with Infostud

To register with Infostud, you will need to enter your details in the form available on the Sapienza website at the following link <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students>

If you are an Italian citizen, you will need your SPID or Cie credentials.

Please note

If you are already registered with Infostud, you must verify/enter your email address on the Idm dashboard by logging in with your Spid/Cie credentials or your student ID number and password <https://idm.uniroma1.it/>

The email address entered on Infostud at the time of registration must be correct and valid and must be checked regularly during the procedure as it will be used for any communications from the University.

6. Payment of the € 45,00 fee

To pay the € 45,00 fee to Sapienza:

- log in to Infostud with your credentials <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students>;
- click on “Degree programmes”;

- go to “Access to programmes”;
- enter the code for the date on which you wish to take the test ([point 4](#))
- go to Continue and then Next;
- click on Direct payment (PagoPA). You can only pay online, by credit card.

Please pay attention to the **deadlines** and the **code** to be entered for payment indicated in [point 4](#).

The € 45,00 fee will not be refunded for any reason.

Please note

After registering for the test in @HOME mode **and only after the payment deadline of € 45,00 for each date**, you will receive instructions from Cisia on how to take the test at the email address you provided when registering with Infostud.

Those who take the test undertake to maintain confidentiality regarding its contents.

7. Enrolment

Final enrolment in the degree programme is obtained by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees for the 2026-2027 academic year, plus a stamp duty of € 16,00 and the regional tax.

The code to be entered is:

- **33537** if you wish to enrol in the Global Humanities degree programme,
- **33528** if you wish to enrol in the Classics degree programme.

During the procedure, you may enter any conditions for exemption from enrolment fees and regional tax. The € 16,00 stamp duty is payable in all cases.

7.1 – Enrolment deadlines

If you have taken the ENGLISH TEST HUM@HOME and have an Italian or foreign qualification, in order to enrol you must pay the first instalment of the university enrolment fees between **1 September 2026 and Thursday 5 November 2026**.

Please note: you can enrol in the degree programmes listed in the following call for applications even **if you have taken the ENGLISH TOLC-E or SAT** (and are therefore exempt from taking the HUM@HOME ENGLISH TEST) in the periods specified below:

for the Global Humanities degree programme

- the ENGLISH TOLC-E from 1 July 2024
- the SAT from 1 January 2021;

for the Classics degree programme

- the ENGLISH TOLC-E from 1 July 2024
- the SAT from 1 January 2023.

If you have taken the ENGLISH TOLC-E, after taking the test you must register with Infostud ([point 5](#)) and pay a fee of € 10,00 from 2 July to 29 October 2026 by following the procedure below:

- Log in to Infostud with your credentials <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina-strutturale/students>;
- Click on “Degree programmes”;
- Go to “Access to programmes”;
- Enter the programme code
 - 33537 for the Global Humanities degree programme,
 - 33528 for the Classics degree programme,
- Go to Continue and then Next;
- Click on Direct payment (PagoPA). You can only pay online, by credit card;
- Pay the first instalment of your university enrolment fees starting from 1 September 2026 and by Thursday 5 November 2026

If you have taken the SAT and have an Italian or foreign qualification, in order to enrol you must:

- log in to Infostud with your credentials;
- click on Profile>Isee> Acquire Isee (only if you are a tax resident in Italy);
- enter any conditions for exemption from enrolment fees and regional tax
- send the SAT Score Report to the Administrative Office of Letters and Philosophy at the email address segrstudenti.filesuso@uniroma1.it by 29 October 2026, requesting the generation of the enrolment fee payment slip;
- pay the first instalment of university enrolment fees starting from 1 September 2026 and by 5 November 2026 using the following procedure:
- log in to Infostud with your credentials;
- Click on Payment Slips and then on Generated Payment Slips;
- Pay the amount online using PagoPA (direct payment).

If you wish, you can attend classes even before paying the enrolment fee.

7.2 – For those who have a qualification obtained in a foreign secondary education system

If you have a qualification obtained in a foreign secondary education system, in order to enrol you must follow the instructions on the Sapienza website [Go to page](#) (for foreign qualifications, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#)).

7.3 – For those who need to transfer from another Sapienza programme

If you are currently enrolled in another Sapienza programme and wish to request recognition of the exams taken in your previous programme, you must submit a transfer application using the form ‘Passaggio di corso con riconoscimento esami’ (Programme transfer with exam recognition), available on the university website in the Attachments section of the following page: <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/international-student-office>.

The transfer application must be sent by email no later than the deadline for payment of the programme registration fees indicated in [point 7.1](#), addressing both the administrative office of your current programme and the administrative office of the programme you wish to enrol in ([point 10](#)).

Please note: after submitting your transfer application, you will not be able to take exams for your original programme.

7.4 – For those who need to transfer from another Italian university

If you are currently enrolled in a degree programme at another Italian university and wish to request recognition of the exams taken in your original degree programme, you must pay the enrolment fee for the new degree programme you have chosen no later than the deadlines indicated in [point 7.1](#) and, within ten days of paying the fees, you must submit a transfer application.

Please note: after paying the transfer fee, you will not be able to take exams for your original degree programme.

7.5 – For those who have an Italian university degree

If you already have a degree from an Italian university and wish to request recognition of university credits acquired during your previous degree programme, you must submit your application **within 15 calendar days of paying the first instalment of the degree programme enrolment fees**, following the instructions on the Sapienza website. [Go to the page](#)

If you obtained your degree from a university other than Sapienza, you must also attach a self-certification of your qualification, complete with details of the exams, the relevant grades, Scientific Disciplinary Sectors (SSD) and credits.

The request will be assessed by the relevant Faculty bodies.

7.6 – For those who have a degree from a foreign university system

If you have obtained a degree from a foreign university system and wish to request recognition of university exams taken abroad, you must follow the instructions on the Sapienza website on the dedicated page [Go to page](#) (for foreign degrees, see Annex 2 of this call for applications [point A2.5](#));

8. Withdrawal from enrolment

If, after paying the fees, you wish to withdraw from the degree programme, you must follow this procedure:

- activate your institutional email address as indicated on the University website at <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/email-google-apps>;
- connect to the ticket platform <https://tts.uniroma1.it/otrs/customer.pl> select the secretariat responsible for your course of study; select the service “Rinuncia agli studi” (Withdrawal from studies), fill in the relevant form and attach the receipt for payment of the stamp duty.

Withdrawal from enrolment for non-EU citizens who hold a residence permit for study purposes

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country, hold a residence permit for study purposes and withdraw your enrolment at Sapienza or another university, **you will lose the requirements for residence in Italy and your residence permit will be revoked.**

In this case, you will have to return to your country of origin and complete the pre-selection procedure on the QS MoveIn platform again by 15 May 2026 (<https://www.uniroma1.it/en/admissions>) and the pre-enrolment procedure via the University online platform (<https://www.universitaly.it/>) by 30 June 2026 at the latest.

9. Further Required Courses (OFA)

Further Required Courses (OFAs) in ACADEMIC ENGLISH are assigned to those who achieve a score of **less than 12/30** in the HUM@HOME ENGLISH TEST.

Those who are required to fulfil Further Required Courses (OFAs) will be assisted by the programme tutors, who will support them in catching up.

OFA requirements are fulfilled by passing the relevant remedial test OFA at the end of **a specific course organised by the Faculty** or at least **one of the following exams**:

For the bachelor's degree in Global humanities:

Words of History: A Global Exploration (6 CFU)

For the bachelor's degree in Classics:

Classical Archaeology (6 CFU)

The procedures for participating in remedial courses, for taking the Further Required Courses test (OFA test) and all other news regarding Further Required Courses will be published in the Attendance section of the degree programme's page, in the course catalogue <https://corsidilaurea.uniroma1.it/en>

The OFA must be passed within the first year of the programme. If you do not pass the OFA, you will not be able to take exams for the years following the first, starting from the 2027-2028 academic year.

Please note: if you are eligible for exemption and have taken the ENGLISH TOLC-E or SAT instead of the ENGLISH TEST HUM, the thresholds for OFA attribution are:

- **13/36** in the ENGLISH TOLC-E
- **960/1600** in the SAT.

Annex 1 - ENGLISH TEST HUMANITIES@HOME (ENGLISH TEST HUM@HOME)

You can take the ENGLISH TEST HUM@HOME if you are enrolled in the fourth or fifth year of secondary school or if you have already obtained a diploma.

The ENGLISH TEST HUM is an assessment test designed to ascertain your readiness for university studies, developed by the Interuniversity Consortium for Integrated Access Systems (CISIA).

A1.1 - Test registration

Registration for the ENGLISH TEST HUM @HOME is completed upon payment of the € 45,00 fee ([point 6](#)).

A1.2 - Test structure and assessment

The test consists of 3 sections with 10 questions per section and a maximum time limit of 30 minutes per section. The sections are:

- Reading and comprehension
- Clues and inductive reasoning
- Reasoning on texts and data

There are 5 answer options, only one of which is correct. The result is given by 1 point for each correct answer and 0 points for unanswered and incorrect answers.

Annex 2 - Citizenship of foreign countries and/or qualifications obtained in a foreign education system

A2.1 – Citizenship of EU countries and non-EU countries holding a residence permit in Italy (non-EU equivalent)

The following persons are eligible to apply:

- citizens of one of the countries of the European Union or one of the following countries: Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland, the Republic of San Marino, the Vatican City State;
- have dual citizenship, one of which is from a European Union country;
- have citizenship of a non-EU country but hold one of the following residence permits issued by the Italian State
 - o EU long-term residence permit;
 - o Residence permit for employed or self-employed work;
 - o Residence permit for family reasons;
 - o Residence permit for political asylum, subsidiary protection or special reasons;
 - o Residence permit for religious reasons;
 - o Residence card Article 50 TEU – Art 18.4 EU-UK Withdrawal Agreement
- are citizens of a non-EU country but have been legally resident in Italy for at least one year and hold a secondary school diploma obtained in Italy that gives access to the chosen course of study, or hold a degree or an accredited Foundation Year certificate obtained at an Italian university, duly recognised by the MUR, in the 2025/2026 academic year;
- are citizens of a non-EU country and are legally enrolled in a degree programme at an Italian university, hold a valid residence permit for study purposes and intend to apply for transfer or transition for years subsequent to that of initial enrolment;
- are citizens of a non-EU country and are part (themselves or a parent or spouse) of the staff serving in foreign diplomatic missions and international organisations based in Italy, accredited to the Italian State or the Holy See. Their residence permit for diplomatic reasons must be submitted.

If you hold a residence permit for study purposes issued for:

- an Italian language course
- an exchange/mobility programme
- a single course

please refer to [point A2.3](#)

A2.2 – Dual citizenship

If you have dual citizenship, one of which is Italian or from another EU country, Italian citizenship or that of another EU country prevails (Law No. 218 of 31 May 1995, Article 19, paragraph 2) and therefore, in order to enrol in the course of study indicated in this call for applications, you must follow the instructions provided for those who have citizenship of an EU country and a non-EU country and hold a valid residence permit in Italy (non-EU equivalent).

A2.3 – Non-EU citizenship, residence abroad and study visa application

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country, reside in a country other than Italy and do not meet the requirements indicated in point A2.1, in order to enrol in the degree programme indicated in this call for applications, you must apply for an entry visa for study purposes as indicated in [point 2.2](#).

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country and hold a residence permit for study in Italy issued to attend an Italian language course or to spend a period of exchange/mobility, in order to enrol in the course of study in this call for applications, you must return to your country of origin and apply for an entry visa for study purposes as indicated in [point 2.2](#).

A residence permit for study purposes issued for a “Single course” will be considered valid for university enrolment as a EU-equivalent student just in case all the three following points are met in Academic Year 2025/2026:

- You have entered Italy with a study visa released for a single course
- You have fully attended and positively passed the single course

- The single course is relevant for the degree course you are requiring to be enrolled in. If even one of the listed requirements is not applicable, in order to enroll in the study program under this call, you must return to your country of origin and submit the application for a study visa as indicated in [punto 2.2.](#)

A2.4 – “Marco Polo” programme

If you are a Chinese citizen, are participating in the “Marco Polo” project for Sapienza and have submitted your pre-enrolment application to the Italian diplomatic-consular representatives in China for the 2025/2026 academic year, you can participate in the selection process for places reserved for the “Marco Polo” project.

A2.5 – Enrolment for those with a foreign qualification

A2.6 – Shortened programme for those with university degrees obtained abroad

Those who have a degree obtained in a foreign university system and wish to apply for recognition of university exams taken abroad must submit a request with a € 16,00 stamp to the International Student Office within 30 days of the date of enrolment, following the procedure below:

- complete enrolment and pay the enrolment fees using the procedures indicated in [point 7.1](#);
- activate your institutional email address using the methods indicated on the university website at the following page <https://www.uniroma1.it/en/pagina/email-google-apps>;
- send a ticket to the International Student Secretariat <https://tts.uniroma1.it/otrs/customer.pl> by filling in the application form and attaching the documents indicated on the Sapienza website, on the dedicated page. [Go to page](#) (14. Course abbreviation)

After administrative checks, the “Hello - International Student Office” reserves the right to request further documentation if it deems it necessary and to reject the request for recognition if the necessary requirements are not met.

Once the necessary checks on the foreign qualifications submitted have been completed, the application will be sent by the Hello - International Student Office to the relevant student office for administrative processing. The application will be assessed by the relevant faculty bodies.

Annex 3 - Services for SLDs – Specific Learning Difficulties

A3.1 – Request for SLD aids for the HUM@HOME ENGLISH TEST

If you have been diagnosed with SLD, as referred to in Law No. 170/2010 and Ministerial Decree No. 5669/2011, and require special aids for the ENGLISH TEST HUM@ CASA, you require special aids in relation to the type of SLD, **you must make an explicit request on the Infostud System** during the procedure for generating the payment of the € 45,00 fee and send the certification to testaccesso.inclusione@uniroma1.it

In this case, the following is granted:

- additional time equal to 30% more than that defined for the Test;
- the use of a basic non-scientific calculator, depending on the certification provided.

Requests must be received by the test registration deadline and must be accompanied by appropriate SLD certification issued by National Health Service facilities or by specialists and facilities accredited by the National Health Service.

If the attached documents do not specify the accreditation of the institutions **or specialists** that issued the certification, a note must be added with the details confirming such accreditation.

The SLD certification must be detailed and clear, referring to the nosographic codes and explicitly stating the SLD (reading and/or writing and/or calculation).

The diagnosis must have been issued no more than three years ago if it was made for minors.

A3.2 – SLD certification for those residing in foreign countries

If you reside in a foreign country and have a diagnosis of SLD, in order to take advantage of the accommodations during the test, you must submit the legalised certification, when required by current international regulations, attesting to the SLD status issued in your country of residence, accompanied by a translation, sworn by an official translator or certified as conforming to the original text by Italian diplomatic representatives, in Italian or English.

The certification must be sent to testaccesso.inclusione@uniroma1.it.

Annex 4 - English language proficiency requirements

To be admitted to degree programmes, applicants must have a knowledge of English equivalent to at least level **B2** according to the [Common European Framework of Reference for Languages \(CEFR\)](#). To demonstrate their knowledge of English, applicants must meet at least one of the following requirements:

For the Global Humanities degree programme:

Have one of the following certifications:

IELTS, TOEFL iBT, TOEIC (reading, writing, listening, speaking), Cambridge Assessment English, MET (reading, writing, listening, speaking), Pearson English International Certificate, Oxford Test of English, Trinity College London Integrated Skills in English – ISE (reading, writing, listening, speaking).

Certification is not mandatory for:

- specific categories of vulnerability (refugees; asylum seekers; displaced persons and stateless persons, persons from countries at war; persons with psychological, physical or cognitive disabilities); for these categories, the Commission will decide how to assess level B2;
- those who hold a secondary school diploma in English.

To certify the above conditions or level B2 of English language proficiency, you must send certification of level B2 or vulnerability status or academic career in English to globalhumanities.sapienza@uniroma1.it by 29 October 2026, otherwise you will not be able to enrol. Please note: the relevant offices will verify the certificates and any irregular enrolments will be cancelled.

For the Classics - Classical Civilisation and Literature degree programme:

a) Have **one of the following certificates** attesting to B2 level English language proficiency:

- IELTS with a minimum score of 5.5
- TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 80
- Cambridge English B2 (First or higher)
- Trinity College London Integrated Skills in English - ISE (level II or higher)

b) Fall into one of the following categories:

- Be a native English speaker
- Have a diploma/degree in **English language** issued by an accredited institution in the EU/EEA/Schengen area or in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States;
- Have an **International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma** or a **General Certificate of Education (GCE)** or an equivalent diploma/certificate.

Applications without language certification (point a) or other certification deemed equivalent (point b) will be considered incomplete and therefore will not be accepted.

Annex 5 - ISEE for the right to university education

The ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) for the right to university education is necessary to obtain a reduction in the amount of enrolment fees (the lower the ISEE value, the lower the amount to be paid).

The ISEE calculation for university education benefits must be requested from the Tax Assistance Centres (CAF) after 15 January 2026 and at least 30 days before the deadlines ([point 7.1](#)).

Those who have a PIN code or SPID digital identity (unique code for access to all digital and online services of the Public Administration) can also request the calculation of the 2026 ISEE directly online by submitting the DSU (Single Substitute Declaration) on the INPS website (<https://www.inps.it/it/en.html>).

For those who are foreign nationals and/or declare income earned abroad and are therefore unable to produce ISEE certification, there is a fixed registration fee based on the country of origin.
