Prof. Tomáš Zima, MD, DSc.

Rector

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Tomáš Zima graduated from the First Faculty of Medicine of Charles University in Prague, in 1990, after which he worked at the Institute of Medical Chemistry and Biochemistry of the First Faculty of Medicine. In 1999, he switched to the Institute of Medical Biochemistry and Laboratory Diagnostics, which he led until now. In 2001, Mr. Zima became a professor of medical biochemistry. He also specialises in clinical biochemistry, internal medicine and nephrology. In September 2005 Prof. Zima became the Dean of the CU First Faculty of Medicine, a position that he held for seven years. He is a member of the Learned Society of the Czech Republic, the Czech Medical Academy, and the President of the Czech Rectors' Conference. He is author of more than 400 articles and 7 books. From the 1st of February 2014 Prof. Zima is the Rector of Charles University and on the 20th of October 2017 he was elected as the rector of Charles University for another four-year period on. He is a member of UNICA Steering committee and a member of EUROPAEUM Board of Trustees since 2016.

Prof. PaedDr. Radka Wildová, CSc.

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Prof. PaedDr. Wildová was Dean of the Faculty of Education of Charles University from 2009 to 2016 and since 2016 she is a vice-Rector for Education. She is active in the Association of the Deans of Pedagogical Faculties of the Czech Republic and is a member of the team of advisors to the Minister for Education, Youth and Sports. Her chief professional interests are the issues of

initial literacy, the didactics of primary education, professional preparation of educational workers and educational policy. She is the author of several dozen publications in journals and anthologies in both the Czech Republic and abroad and also of several monographs, the most important of which include Reading Literacy and the Support of its Development in School. Her books for teaching initial literacy are well - known to the wider pedagogical public. She is a member of the Scientific Councils of several foreign universities and associations (f.ex.International Reading Association) and regularly lectures at foreign universities. She is a delegate at the Education and Democracy Committee of the Council of Europe.

Doc. PhDr. Markéta Křížová, Ph.D.

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Markéta Křížová focuses her research on Early Modern intellectual history, European overseas expansion, colonial history of America and the subsequent cultural encounters and competitions. In the past years she has dealt with 3 grant projects (GAUK, GAAV, GAČR) as the main project manager and participated in several international projects. She authored five monographs, a number of individual chapters in monographs and more than 40 specialist articles in journals, took part in various international congresses. She is the member of a steering committee (since 2017 vice-chairman) of the European Network in Universal and Global History. In 2016 she became a member of the Council for Exhibition Activity of the National Museum of the Czech Republic.

PhDr. Zuzana Kasáková, Ph.D.

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Zuzana Kasakova is currently Vice-dean for international relations and assistant professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences, Charles University. She also cooperates as associate research fellow with EUROPEUM Institute for European Policy. Between February 2012 and January 2014 she was the chair of the Academic Senate of the Faculty. Her research focuses on political development and history of the United Kingdom with special attention to the "Celtic fringe", EU history and institutional development, regionalism, seccession and minority nationalism in Europe. She has also coordinated and participated in number of European and national research projects, and projects focusing on curricula innovations.

Prof. JUDr. Michal Skřejpek, DrSc.

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Prof. Skřejpek is a professor of Roman law. His primary interests focus on the study of the influence of Roman law on the contemporary Czech civil law. His next fields of interest is roman criminal law and the administration of the Roman Empire. Prof. Skřejpek has led a number of grant projects (GAČR, GAUK) and he is a member of the council of the research project Progres of the Faculty of Law. Prof. Skřejpek published a series of monographs on the relationship between Roman law and religion, on imperial offices in the time of Principate, relationship between Roman public and private law), a number of individual chapters in monographs and more than 200 specialised articles in scientific journals. He is a member of the Scientific council

of the Charles University, Faculty of Law and of the Police Academy of the Czech Republic. He works as a permanent member of the Scientific council of the international conferences "Diritto romano e attualità", whose co-founder he is. Prof Skřejpek is a member of many editorial boards (e. g. Fundamina, Law Quarterly Journal) and editor of the book series "Fontes iuris romani", in which he published his translations of the Institutes and Digest of Justinian.

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


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Miroslava Černochová graduated from the Faculty of Mathematics and Physics at Charles University in 1982. Since 1985, she has worked in the Department of Information Technology and Technical Education at the Faculty of Education of Charles University. She is a teacher educator in the Masters' Degree Study Programme for student teachers of ICT and of Informatics and Technical Education in primary and secondary schools. An extramural member of the Supervisory Panel for PhD Studies in Informatics Education at the Faculty of Mathematics, Physics and Informatics of Comenius University in Bratislava (Slovakia), she is also a member of the Faculty of Education's Council for Doctoral Studies in "Theory for Informatics Education" at the Palacky University in Olomouc. She is, since 2017, an external examiner of the panel of experts for projects focussed on implementing the Czech Government's national Strategy for Digital Education, which is managed by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport. As Vice-Dean for International Affairs and the ERASMUS+ co-ordinator. Dr. Černochová has, since 2007, been a member of the faculty management team and a member of the scientific (research) committee at the Faculty of Education, Charles University. She has participated in many EU projects (e.g., 2AgePro, Do It Yourself in Education: Expanding digital competence to foster student agency and collaborative learning (DIYLab), Images and Identity: Improving Citizenship through Digital Media etc.). She is a member of the WG 3.1. of the International Federation for Information Processing (IFIP). Since 2004 she has been a chair of the RDC "Teacher Education and Digital Technology" in the Association of Teacher Education in Europe (ATEE). Since 2013 she has been a member of the international Working Group for Initiatives of UNESCO (EDUsummIT).

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Prof. Zima's primary interests are in the development of electrochemical or separation analytical methods for the determination of biologically active organic compounds important from the point of view of environmental protection and human health. Prof. Zima has dealt with 16 grant projects (GAČR, GAUK, FRVŠ) as the main project manager or co-manager. He is the chairman of doctoral board for analytical chemistry program. At present, he is the dean of the Faculty of Science. Prof. Zima is the author of several chapters in monographs, and of more than 180 articles in scientific journals with more than 2300 citations, and two patents. He is a member of the International Society for Electrochemistry and the Czech Chemical Society. During his professional career he spent more than two years abroad working at various universities, and their laboratories.

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Prof. Kratochvíl's primary interests are in Discrete Mathematics (Graph Theory) and in Theoretical Computer Science (Algorithms and Computational Complexity of Graph Theoretical Problems). Prof. Kratochvíl has been a Fulbright fellow at University of Oregon in the U. S. A., a visiting professor at Bordeaux University and University of Metz in France. He was the principal investigator of several research grants, among them the project leader of GraDR EUROGIGA Project No. 10-EuroGIGA-OP-003 in the ESF EUROCORES program (a team from Universita Tres was and associated partner in this project). Prof. Kratochvíl co-authored over 120 research papers in international journals and refereed conference proceedings, the WoS counts over 1200 citations to these papers, he guest-edited over 20 conference proceedings and special journal issues and delivered over 20 keynote lectures at international conferences. Prof. Kratochvíl is a steering committee member of international conference series WG – Graph Theoretical Concepts in Computer Science and GROW – Graph Classes, Optimization and Width Parameters. In 2002-2010 he was the president of the Czech Mathematical Society and in 2005-2010 he served as the chair of the Committee for Support of East European Mathematicians of the European Mathematics Society.

Doc. MUDr. Jiří Špaček, Ph.D.

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Dr. Radek Tichý has one doctorate in sociology and one in theology. His specialization is the liturgical theology whi he had studied at the University of St. Anselmo in Rome. His

specialisation is the current Catholic liturgy and its connections in the postmodern world. He is the author of four monographs, one of which was published in Rome. At the Catholic Theological Faculty he is the head of the Department of Pastoral Theology and Law Sciences.

PhDr. Lenka Škrábalová, Ph.D.

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Lenka Škrábalová studied West European Studies and International Relations at Faculty of Social Sciences at Charles University; she obtained her PhD degree in International Area Studies at Charles University as well. Before coming to Charles University, she worked for almost 12 years as a civil servant at Czech State Administration. She was the head of European Affairs Unit at Ministry of Industry and Trade (2007 – 2016) and the head of bilateral and multilateral relations unit at Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports (2016 – 2017). Lenka's areas of responsibility include: formulation and implementation of Internationalisation Strategy of Charles University, overall strategic planning and project development, work planning for the department and developing relations with international university associations (UNICA, IFPU, Coimbra Group, Europaeum). In August 2017, she became the director of International Relations Office at the Rectorate of Charles University.

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Marie Mickova has worked in the International Relations Office at the Charles University Rectorate since 2016 in the position of coordinator for North, East, South and Central Europe and Central Asia.
