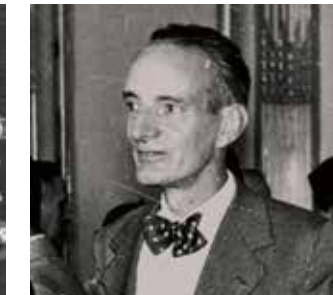
GUGLIELMO MARCONI

1963 Nobel Prize for Chemistry, taught Physical Chemistry in 1935-1937



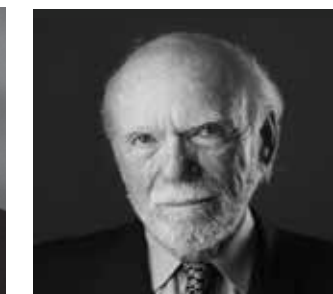
CARLO RUBBIA
