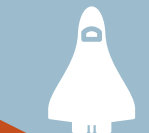

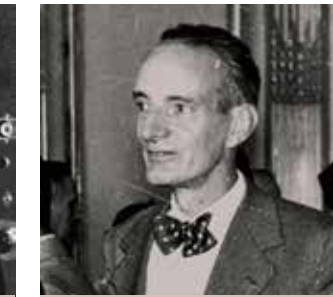
Sapienza Nobel Prizes

1957 Nobel Prize for Medicine, taught Psychobiology in 1971-1982



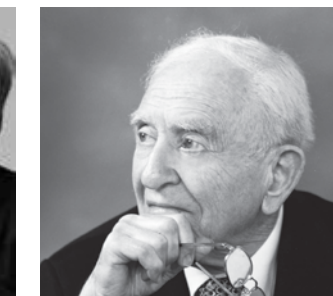
EMILIO SEGRÈ

1963 Nobel Prize for Chemistry, taught Physical Chemistry in 1935-1937



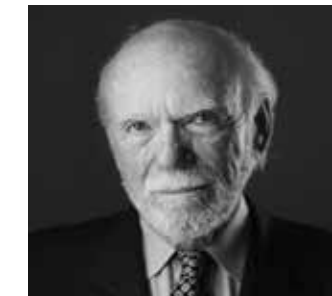
CARLO RUBBIA
