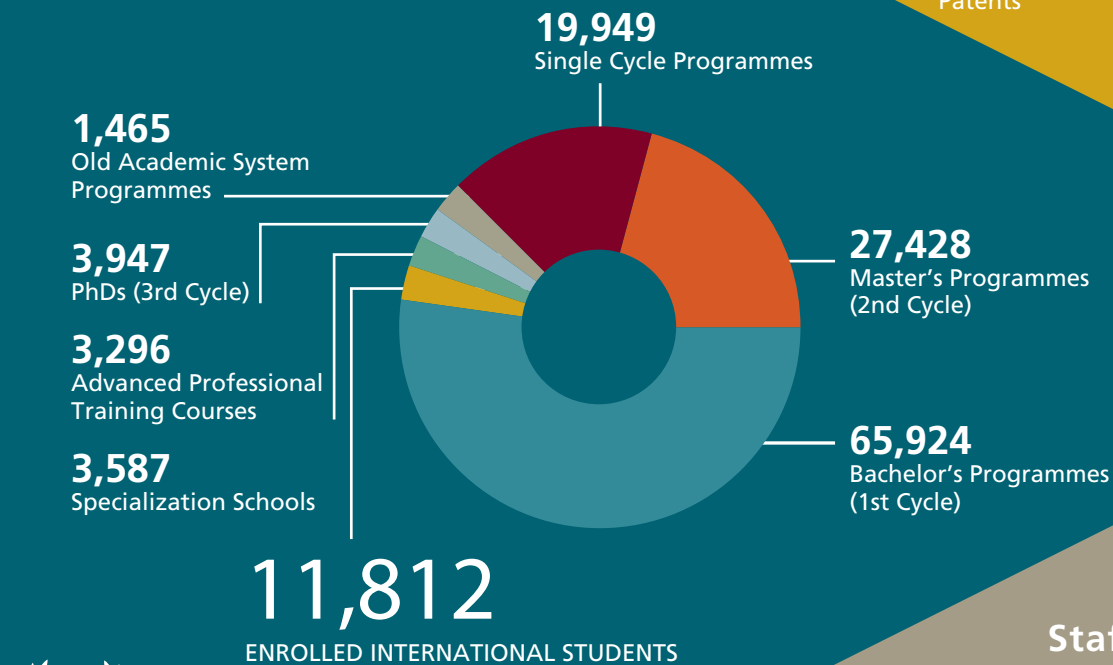
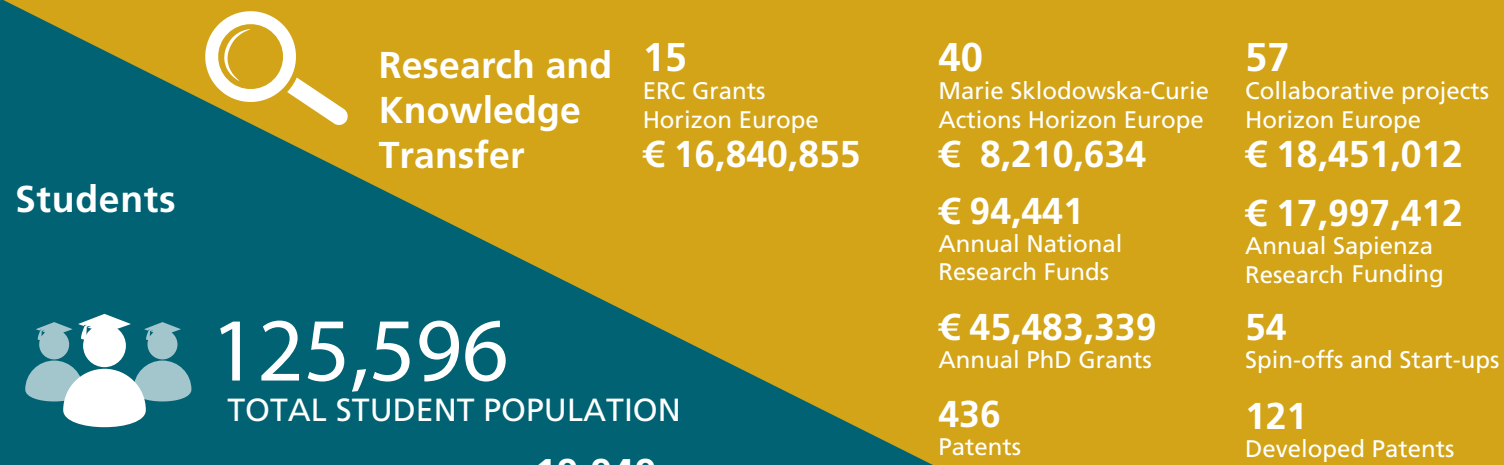

in 1971-1982



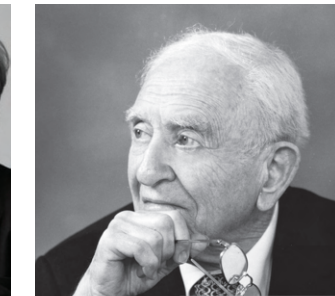
EMILIO SEGRÈ

in 1935-1937



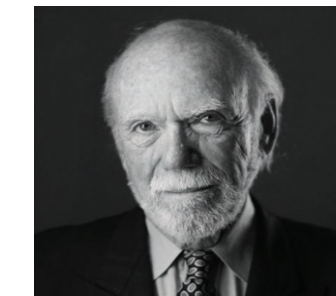
CARLO RUBBIA
