1 - Aims

The Summer School "URBAN POVERTY. The praxis of planning in the unequal cities" offers an intensive training program for the acquisition of individual skills about: a) theories and the international debate on urban poverty; b) research methods and tools to understand, analyse and treat the urban poverty at the urban scale; c) techniques and strategies of valorisation of tangible and intangible, urban and architectural resources, through the recovery of identity and local development. Indeed, according to the development of inequalities at the urban scale, there is an urgent need for a better understanding of complex models of intervention against poverty within the local development frameworks and the tradition of recovery and enhancement of identities and endogenous resources. Therefore, a better understanding of the spatial dimension of poverty and the implications at the urban scale of situated inequalities, should allow to define and interpret new directions of development and multi-scale and multi-disciplinary actions on the cities and territories, through integrated projects conducted on buildings, spaces and with resident populations.

2 – Admission requirements

The Summer School welcomes Italian and foreign students with at least a secondary school diploma or equivalent educational title from foreign institutions, or students enrolled in a university course. All documentation should be submitted in one of the following languages: English or Italian. Participants who are not enrolled in a university, but have a secondary school diploma, are requested to indicate a national website where it is possible to verify that the possessed diploma qualifies access to a university.



3 – Available positions

The minimum number of participants to activate a course is **6**. There is not a maximum number.

4 – Duration and organisation of teaching activities

The Summer School lasts one week (4 days). Lessons will start on September 12th, 2017 and finish on September 15th, 2017. The training activity is equal to 28 hours of overall commitment, of which dedicated 16 hours of frontal teaching and 12 hours of a conducted experimental workshop.

Modulo 1 _Conceptual frameworks and theoretical debates about urban poverty, 3h, prof. Ananya Roy Contents: In this first module, information and theoretical knowledge useful to frame the issue of urban poverty as discussed and debated at the international level will be provided.	2

Ananya Roy Content: The module provides examples, case studies and practical guidance for developing research strategies useful for understanding the spatial dimensions of urban and territorial level poverty;	
Modulo 3 _Critical discussion of the role of urban planning in relation to urban poverty, 2h, prof. Ananya Roy Content: The module offers hypotheses and guidelines for the treatment of the spatial implications of situated inequalities trying to define the specific role of urban planning, as an interdisciplinary practice for the intervention in marginal urban areas;	
Modulo 4 _ Buildings and places restoring and local identity enhancing: theories and practices, 2h, prof. Daniela Esposito Content: The module provides knowledge on action strategies for local development and recovery of identities and heritage resources, especially for public use, starting with the work carried out on buildings, spaces and resident populations;	
Modulo 5 _Italian cases-studies and indicators: comparisons and challenges, 2h, prof. Daniela De Leo Content: The module provides knowledge on divergent models of action against poverty and interprets new multi-scale survey methods about cities and territories through research hypotheses, definitions and interpretations for a better understanding and a more efficient action;	



Modulo 6 _Roma cases-studies and indicators: comparisons and challenges, 2h, prof. Salvatore Monni Content: Definition of the problematic issues in the Roman urban areas with reference to the research conducted on the basis of indicators, and located analysis;	
Modulo 7_ Urban poverty and Social Cohesion policies 2h, prof. Enrica Morlicchio Content: The module provides knowledge on the relationship between cohesion policy and the different dimensions of territorial poverty;

5.1 Submission of the application form for admission

To enrol in the Summer School “Urban Poverty”, candidates must:

1 - Register on-line with the Sapienza (Infostud) at <http://www.uniroma1.it/studenti>. Once your registration is completed, the system will provide you with a registration number and a password to access the system. You must use this registration number on your application form.

PLEASE NOTE: it is very important that a valid email address be provided as the system password will be sent to that e-mail address. If the candidate is or has been a Sapienza student, he/she will already have a registration number. If the candidate does not remember their registration number or password, the Infostud recovery procedure can be used.



2 - To enrol in this Summer School, candidates must fill out the admission application form (Attachment 1 to this call) and enclose:

- Copy of a valid ID, signed and legible (I.D. Card / Passport);
- Diploma/Enrolment Certificate;
- *Curriculum vitae et studiorum*, in EU format;
- Consent to use personal data (Attachment 2 to this call).

The deadline for submitting applications is June 29th, 2017.

Applications received after the deadline will be rejected.

5.2 List of Applicants

The Summer School Secretariat will verify the fulfilment of the requirements and will publish the list of the admitted students on the web page <http://www.uniroma1.it/didattica/offerta-formativa/corsi-di-formazione-e-alta-formazione/corsi-di-formazione>, according to the following deadline: **30th June 2017**

After the publication of the list will be possible to pay the tuition fees.

6 – Tuition fees

The Summer School tuition fees for each participants is € 150,00 to be paid according to the mode of the point 7.1 and 7.2 **no later than July 10th, 2017**. Students, PhD candidates and research fellows of the Sapienza University can apply for a scholarship for full coverage of the Summer School costs by participating in the appropriate notice attached (Annex 3). To take advantage of the scholarships will still need the payment of stamp duty within the specified article. 5.1.

Tuition fees do not include traveling expenses, meals and accommodation, and local transportation. Tuition fees will be refunded if the Summer School is not activated. To obtain a refund, students should write to the Director of the Summer School.

7.1 – Method of payment

Students admitted to the course must login to INFOSTUD

(<https://stud.infostud.uniroma1.it/Sest/Log/>) and click on "TASSE", then "alta formazione/formazione", enter the code indicated on the call for applications and click "AVANTI" and then "STAMPA".



Tuition fees must be paid within the deadline indicated in this call (see Point 6) by presenting the payment slip downloaded from INFOSTUD at any UniCredit branch located throughout the country and can be made:

- in cash;
- by check of the exact amount indicated on INFOSTUD, payable to "Gruppo UniCredit – Banca, issued by the student, if he/she holds an account with UniCredit or any other bank in Italy;
- by check of the exact amount indicated on INFOSTUD, payable to the student, issued by a third person holding an account with any bank in Italy or abroad.

Purposes of the processing

In accordance with the section 13 D.lgs. n.196/2003 the provided data will be processed in the necessary measure and for the purposes connected to the enrollment and the attendance to the training course.

Methods of processing and subjects involved

The processing will be done both manually and by computer. The data may be communicated to institutions or public and private authorities if strictly necessary for the scope of the teaching activities of the course.

Nature of the provision of the data and consequences of a potential refusal

The provision of the data is mandatory, and the potential refusal of the provision involves the impossibility of the enrollment in the course and the management of the connected procedural activities, as well as the teaching activities.

Holder and supervisor of the processing

The holder of the processing of the data is the Università degli Studi di Roma represented in person by its pro tempore legal representative, the Magnifico Rettore, domiciled for the role at the university's headquarters. The supervisor of the processing is the Director of the Training Course. Section 7 d.lgs. 196/2003 - Right to Access Personal Data and Other Rights

- The data subject shall have the right to be informed

- a) of the source of the personal data;
- b) of the purposes and methods of the processing;
- c) of the logic applied to the processing, if the latter is carried out with the help of electronic means;

- The subject shall have the right to obtain
