Article 2 - Educational Information

13	Learning objectives	The Master's course provides an in-depth knowledge of the constitutional law and administrative law of the European Union (EU) and its members states (MS) taking into account the different national traditions through a comparative approach. The activities carried out during the course aim to address, in particular, issues related to the application of the concept of Rule of Law, the EU multilevel governance, adjudication and economic institutions, the forms of government and democratic challenges in MS as well as developments in rights protection. Furthermore, the Master's program offers a
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		comprehensive and solid introduction to public policy, European and comparative public law. It is also intended to enable participants to up-to-date their knowledge of the most recent regulations and policies governing the EU. Activities focus on issues related to certain specific and fundamental sectors, which play an increasingly important role within the framework of European and national public policies. Especially, reference is made to those on environmental protection, digital technologies, public contracts, as well as those concerning the relations between the European Central Bank (ECB) and national central banks. The course enables participants to improve their knowledge of both EU and national law and policies, also with a view to issues concerning Global Public Law, such as the protection of human rights, due process, the handling of terrorism, and world trade law.
14	Expected Learning Outcomes	The teaching method is inspired by a theoretical-practical approach to learning, focusing on concrete problems and issues raised within the context of the topics covered. As a result, participants will be able to master notions and tools necessary to navigate national and supranational environments and integrate into the current global one. The course's cross-cutting approach concerning the main themes and issues affecting European and comparative public law, as well as political and economic sciences, enables students to acquire knowledge and skills applicable in various professional contexts, regardless of their different backgrounds (legal, socio-political, or economic). The course also enables students to examine current political and socioeconomic developments, as well as to analyse the main challenges of the contemporary era from different perspectives. The course also aims to improve the understanding of the different roles and interests of governmental and non-governmental actors involved in national, supranational and global arenas.
