13	<b>Learning objectives</b>	<p>This course provides an in-depth knowledge of the constitutional and administrative law of the European Union (EU) and the Member States, taking into account different national traditions through a comparative approach.</p> <p>The activities carried out during the course aim to focus on issues related to the rule of law, to the constitutional order and governance of the EU and the Member States, with particular reference to democratic structures, fundamental rights and administrative procedures and problems. The course also provides a comprehensive and solid introduction to public policy.</p>

		<p>The course is intended to enable participants to update their knowledge of the most recent regulations and policies governing the EU and the Member States in specific and fundamental sectors. In particular, the following areas will be studied: environmental protection, digital technologies, public contracts, relations between the European Central Bank (ECB) and national central banks.</p> <p>The course will also provide an in-depth view of issues concerning public law at a global level, such as the protection of human rights, due process, the fight against terrorism, and world trade law.</p>
<b>14</b>	<b>Expected learning outcomes</b>	<p>The teaching method is both theoretical and practical. As a result, participants will be able to master notions and tools useful to cope with complex problems in national and supranational environments, as well as integrate themselves in the current global context. The cross-discipline approach of the course, including several fields of law, along with political and economic sciences, enables participants to acquire knowledges and skills that can be applied in various professional contexts, irrespective of their background of study (legal, socio-political, economic).</p> <p>The course will also enable participants to examine current political and socio-economic developments, in order to comprehend their challenges from different perspectives. Furthermore, the course will improve their understanding of the key roles and interests of the different actors (governmental and non-governmental) involved at the national, supranational and global levels.</p>
