He is the Italian member of the European Employment Policy Observatory of the European Commission. His main contributions, which are mainly in the fields of economic theory, monetary policy and behavioral economics, have been published in books and in leading national and international academic journals.</i></p> <p><i>Giovanni Di Bartolomeo is the Program Director. He teaches economic policy and monetary economics at the Sapienza University of Rome. He studied at the University of Barcelona Pompeu Fabra and Sapienza. He has previously taught at the University of Teramo and Antwerp. He was visiting professor at the University of Crete (Marie Curie Fellow), CORE (Louvain), and CEFOS (Gothenburg). He is active in the fields of monetary and fiscal policy, macroeconomics, and experimental economics. His main contributions have been published in leading international academic journals. He has also published two research monographs with Cambridge University Press, and one with Elsevier/Springer. He is policy advisor for different institutions, including the Italian Ministry of Economy and Finance.</i></p>

Silvia Fedeli is Full Professor of Public Finance at Sapienza University of Rome, where she is the Director of the Department of Economics and Law since 2013. She studied in Florence and York. She is fellow of the International Institute of Public Finance, European Public Choice Society, American Public Choice Society, European Economic Association, and SIEP. She regularly publishes in refereed international journals. Her research and teaching interests include the theory of public finance, tax evasion, corruption, and voting system.

Francesco Nucci is Director of the MPhil and PhD Programs in Economics. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Columbia University (New York) and his areas of expertise are macro and international economics. He has published in leading scholarly journals such as *The Journal of International Economics*, *Journal of Money, Credit and Banking*, *European Economic Review*, *Journal of Economic Dynamics and Control* and *Journal of Banking and Finance*. He is member of the Advisory Board at the Department of Treasury of the Ministry of Economy and Finance where he consults for the development and use of econometric models of the Italian Treasury. He has also consulted for the development of statistical models at the State General Accounting Department (RGS) to forecast financial flows between Italy and the EU Institutions (between 2004 and 2013). He has served as Economic counsellor of the Undersecretary of State to the Presidency of the Italian Council of the Ministers, Mr. Enrico Letta (2006 – 2008). Before joining academia in 1996, he has worked at the Bank of Italy as Economist in the Research Department (1995 – 1996) and at the World Bank (Washington D.C.; 1993). He has been Visiting Professor at the Beijing Normal University, the China Academy of Social Science (Beijing, China) and the Asia-Europe Institute, University of Malaya (Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia).

Enrico Saltari is Full Professor of Economia Politica, Facoltà di Economia, Sapienza University of Rome since 2001 (previously at the University of Urbino and Bari). His research is published in *Journal of Monetary Economics*, *Journal of Evolutionary Economics*, *Journal of Economic Behavior and Organization*, *Resource and Energy Economics*, and many other academic journals and books. He has been the editor and coauthored a chapter in *The Economics of Imperfect Markets* (Springer). He has been the editor of special issues for *Economic Modelling*, *Macroeconomic Dynamics*, and *Studies in Nonlinear Dynamics & Econometrics*.
